I am writing to express my deep concern at the ongoing full-frontal attacks on democracy in Turkey. Many of the attacks are focused on democratically elected Kurdish MPs and Mayors, which has resulted in 2000 of these representatives, including seven MPs, being in prison without a fair trial. I believe that this mass incarceration of Kurdish politicians amounts to a violation of fundamental rights including the rights to political association, political participation and freedom of expression. It is also deeply worrying that this undermines the rights of the Turkish people to have their democratic will upheld.

Meanwhile the UK continues to do business almost as usual with Turkey including selling arms and equipment that could be used for the repression of peaceful protest. I strongly object to this policy.

That this House notes that the Turkish authorities have issued arrest warrants for 82 members of the pro-Kurdish People's Democratic Party (HDP), including current and former democratically elected mayors, and the party's current Central Executive Board; further notes that the HDP is the third largest political party in Turkey; notes that in 2019 the HDP won 65 municipalities in local elections and that the Turkish State has arbitrarily taken control of 51 of those municipalities; is deeply concerned that at least 200 democratically elected HDP representatives including seven MPs are imprisoned; believes that this mass incarceration amounts to a violation of fundamental rights including the rights to political association, political participation and freedom of expression; is further deeply concerned that this undermines the rights of the Turkish people to have their democratic will upheld; and calls on the Foreign Secretary to express these concerns to his Turkish counterpart as a matter of utmost urgency.

Dear Mr. Paul Scully, 8th April 2021

I am writing to raise my concerns about the crackdown on the Peoples' Democratic Party (HDP), the third largest party in Turkey, and on democracy and freedom of speech in Turkey more widely. I am concerned by the imprisonment of thousands of HDP members, including former MPs and mayors and party leaders, by the removal of democratically elected mayors, by the forthcoming court case against 108 leading party members on the basis of a tweet (which could see people incarcerated for life), by moves to ban the HDP altogether and prevent 687 party members from taking further part in politics, and by Turkey's refusal to comply with the judgement of the European Court of Human Rights and release former HDP leader, Selahattin Demirtaş. I am concerned by Turkey's withdrawal from the Istanbul Convention on Prevention of Violence Against Women, and by the frequent accounts of detentions of activists and journalists. And I am concerned that despite all this, other governments, including the government of the UK, are doing nothing to put real pressure on Turkey.

I am writing now to ask you to add your name to two EDMs condemning Turkey's attack on the HDP and on democracy, EGM 58292 and EDM 58334.

I am also asking you, as my representative in parliament, to speak out on this issue inside and outside parliament and to call on the UK Government to:

Be more critical of Turkey's human rights abuses and not appease Turkey by acting as though this was of no importance.

Support the use of firm measures (not just words) by the Council of Europe to put pressure on Turkey to comply with the judgement of the European Court of Human Rights and release Selahattin Demirtas immediately.

Put on hold the trade deal with Turkey and not allow preferential treatment in trade deals unless and until there is real improvement in human rights.

End all arms sales to Turkey, including replacement parts for servicing earlier sales.

Use targeted sanctions to hit political leaders and companies complicit in human rights abuses.

Take seriously applications for refugee status by people from Turkey seeking political asylum, and reject any Turkish demands for extradition.
